


Amos Mauk (1859-1876)

On Tuesday of last week, Amos Mauk, son of John Mauk, of Oliver township, met with an accident, if such it may be called. which resulted in his death on the Saturday following. It appears that he, with a brother named Alexander, had been out hunting, and on their return home, in passing an out building, each taking different sides of the building in passing, and while seperated some distance, Alexander drew up the gun, remarking, "I'll shoot you" and by some means the gun was discharged, the whole load, consisting of buckshot, lodging in his brother's side, and causing the fatal results above stated .-Brookville Republican.

Amos Mauk, aged sixteen years, was killed by his brother Alexander, in Jefferson county, last week. The terrible affair was caused by the accidental discharge of a loaded gun which was pointed at the deceased in sport.
