Zola Mae Shaulis Kollock

The family of Zola Mae Shaulis Kollock, 78, celebrates the amazing life of our quick-witted, spirited, talented, and beloved wife, mother, grandmother, sister and aunt. Her family fondly remembers her infectious laughter, animated storytelling, raucous sing-alongs and her thirst for knowledge. She was the cheerleader of the family, forever encouraging and affirming to those she loved.

A world-renowned concert pianist, teacher, and a true supporter of the arts, Zola shared her talent and enthusiasm with many and especially loved teaching her grandchildren. In Ringwood, NJ she started the Marching Kazoo Band. She brought her gifts of music and humor to St. Petersburg, FL when she and her husband Will, a professor and poet, moved to be closer to their family Mila, Jesse, Zoe and Owen Turtle.

Zola began playing the piano at the age of 3. As a child prodigy she studied with Elsie S. Gaspey of Salem, New Jersey, and at age 7 she completely memorized repertoire of 30 classical selections. At the age of 7 she made an astonishing debut performance with the Philadelphia Orchestra conducted by Alexander Hilsberg, playing W.A. Mozart's Piano Concerto in A. The youngest soloist ever to appear with the Orchestra, her performance amazed critics and the Associated Press captioned her "the greatest child pianist since Mozart." In the early days of live TV, she appeared on the shows of Arthur Godfrey, Arthur Murray, Steve Allen, Kate Smith, Victor Borge and the Miss America Show. As she became a mature artist, critics unanimously proclaimed that the development of her talent fulfilled the exciting promise she exhibited as a small child.

Zola was the First Prize Winner of three international piano competitions: The Bach International Competition in Washington D.C., The Concurso Internacional de Piano in Rio de Janeiro, and the Naumburg International Piano Competition. She made her New York City debut in Alice Tully Hall at Lincoln Center in 1970 and her Carnegie Hall solo debut in 1974 as a protégé of Artur Schnabel. She recorded two albums of Bach for Deutsche Grammophone, which were met with critical acclaim. Her Naumburg award resulted in a recording for CRI label of works by Barber, Gruenberg and Bloch. She went on to appear as soloist with the Pittsburgh, Detroit, and San Francisco Symphonies as well as other major American orchestras. She performed Bach's Goldberg Variations in numerous recital tours of Germany and was proclaimed to be "the Bach interpreter" in Europe. She gave solo recitals and performed as soloist with orchestras in Europe, South America and the United States. In South America, during performances in Rio de Janeiro, it was reported that "audiences streamed forward to the stage to applaud and yell bravos for 15 minutes." Zola was the protégé of Agi Jambor for 10 years and continued her studies with Jacques Abram at the University of Toronto.

Born in Lancaster, PA, she was preceded in death by her parents, Celesta Rose Mohnney Shaulis and Newman Nevin Shaulis. She is survived by her husband of 57 years, Will Kollock, daughter Mila Turtle (Jesse), grandchildren Zoe and Owen, sisters Celeste Letchworth and Jane Shaulis (Joseph Gasperec), brother-in-law Joe Kollock (Connie), nephews, Sam and Joe Letchworth and Joe Kollock III (Lisa), extended family and dear friends.

In her honor, contributions may be made to these organizations that were close to her heart: Ringwood Friends of Music, NJ, The Great Auditorium in Ocean Grove Summer Organ Concerts, NJ, where she played concerts from the age of 5 and spent her summers during retirement, and the St. Petersburg Opera Company, FL.

Vern excelled in many sports and had many interests. He was an expert skier and leader in National Ski Patrol. He was a runner. He loved cars and motorcycles. He was proud to be the oldest motorcycle safety trainer in New York State. He hosted table tennis groups in his home for many years.

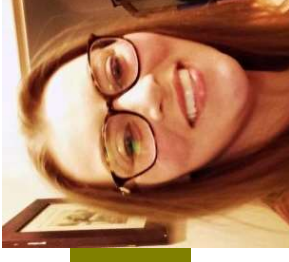

Annie retired from Erisco Industries, she was a faithful member of First Good Samaritan A.M.E. Zion Church for over 20 years.

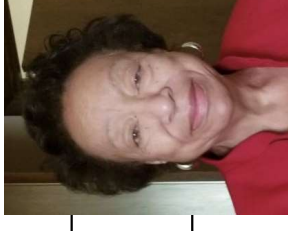
She enjoyed gardening, fishing, cooking and her trips to the casino.
